Floor Schedule and Procedure

- **Suspension Bills:** Today, the House will consider several bills on the Suspension calendar. Bills considered on the Suspension calendar are debatable for 40 minutes; may not be amended; and require a two-thirds vote for passage. If a recorded vote is requested, it will be postponed.
 1. **H.R. 1068** - To amend the High-Performance Computing Act of 1991 (Reps. Baird, Biggert – Science and Technology)
 2. **H.R. 1126** - To reauthorize the Steel and Aluminum Energy Conservation and Technology Competitiveness Act of 1988 (Reps. Lipinski, Ehlers – Science and Technology)
 3. **H.R.85-** Energy Technology Transfer Act(Rep. Biggert – Science and Technology)
 4. **H.Res. 136** - Commending the Girl Scouts of the United States of America on the occasion of their 95th anniversary, for providing quality age-appropriate experiences that prepare girls to become the leaders of tomorrow and for raising issues important to girls (Rep. McCarthy – Oversight and Government Reform)
 5. **H.Res. 89** – Expressing the sense of the House of Representatives that a day should be established as Dutch-American Friendship Day to celebrate the historic ties of the United States and the Netherlands (Rep. Hoekstra – Oversight and Government Reform)

6. **H.Res. 198** – Recognizing the significance of Black History Month
